Cincinnati Therapeutic Riding & Horsemanship Wish List 2016

Capital Items / Improvements to Evolve CTRH into a Comprehensive Equine Therapy Center

Short Term

- 4 corrals with run-in sheds to accommodate 4 additional wild mustangs
- 2 miniature horses (with “mini” trailer) to serve as CTRH “ambassadors”
- Carrot garden for additional therapy for clients, plus yield treats for the horses (of course!)
- Large diameter ceiling fans for indoor arena to address heat index issues
- DLSR camera and video camera for instruction and chronicling
- Outdoor arena improvements plus stadium seating to be able to hold fundraising events
- Warm water wash racks for horses’ comfort
- Automatic fly sprayers for barn stalls for horses’ comfort
- CTRH paratransit shuttle bus to provide transportation solutions for clients

Long Term

- Residence to house clients, allowing for multi-day camping trips, trail rides and clinics
- Expanded stables to accommodate 6 additional horses
- Lounge for CTRH’s 265+ volunteers

Operational Expansion to Increase Equine Therapy’s Scope and Reach in the Community

Short Term

- Programming for families of military veterans
- Training and certification of 5 additional instructors to increase programming
- TIP certification to increase number of mustangs we save
- Add full-time mustang handler to staff
- Multi-day summer camp for children with disabilities

Long Term

- Send riders and mustangs to compete in Mustang Millionaire
- Send riders to compete in: Special Olympics, Invictus Games (once equestrian is added)
- Provide compensation to three staff members who are currently volunteering
- Benefits packages for full-time staff
- Software for tracking horse meds, vet, farrier
- Volunteer coordination software with touchscreen pad for volunteer sign-in
