Impact 100 was thrilled to celebrate 20 years of grantmaking this year. A fun fact, since our inception in 2001, there have been **2,2021** unduplicated members of Impact 100. Through the efforts of these 2,021 members, we are proud to have reached a major milestone -- \$6 million awarded to the Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky community partnering with 55 nonprofit organizations. We also celebrated our 20th Anniversary by awarding the Next Steps Awards for a total of \$55,000 to three grass roots nonprofit organizations with budgets less than \$500,000 that enabled them to take the Next Step. We appreciated our members' passion and commitment to transformational grant making this year as the pandemic continued and many events and committee meetings continued to be virtual. Despite these challenges, almost 200 members were engaged in Committees, Unplug events, and Equity Conversations. We also welcomed five new Young Philanthropists this year continuing the strong pipeline of talented women in Impact 100.

As a volunteer-run organization, 100% of member contributions go directly to the nonprofits we support. In 2021, **472** members accounted for **\$413,000** collectively invested in our community. 
