#### A Thank You From Our President

Dear Friends,

2022 has been an incredible year for Impact 100! Starting our third decade as a women's collective giving philanthropy, we were thrilled to award four transformational grants to four amazing nonprofits in our Greater Cincinnati Community. Since our inception in 2001, over 2,200 unduplicated members have contributed over \$6.4 million dollars to 60 nonprofits that fund initiatives that have improved lives in Greater Cincinnati, Northern Kentucky and Southeastern Indiana. This year, 455 Impact 100 members made it possible to honor, recognize, and support the following nonprofits with grants of \$101,000 each: CITY GOSPEL MISSION, FOUND VILLAGE, LIFE LEARNING CENTER, and PRICE HILL WILL.

In 2022, we adopted an aspirational vision "To be a significant catalyst for creating an equitable thriving community for all" while continuing to hold fast to our core mission and values. We continued to spread the word about Impact 100 through new conversations, connections, and partners. We returned to in-person gatherings including Meet the Finalists, our Education Event focused on Disparities in Health Care, our DEI Conversations, and our Annual Awards Celebration. Importantly, we continued to listen to our two vital stakeholders- our members and nonprofits in the community, to bring "quality and excellence in all the we do" — to our grant processes, our collaborations, our events, and our culture of respect, inclusivity, and belonging. We incorporated education and training on Applying an Equity Lens to the grant applications for our 150 volunteers who served on five Grant Review Teams and our Community Investment Review Committee.

As a volunteer-run organization, 100% of our membership dues are used to fund our transformational grants. We are incredibly grateful for the continuing support we receive from our donors and sponsors that allow us to effectively, efficiently, and successfully manage our organization. Thank you to all our members who contribute, serve on teams and committees and volunteer with our grant applicants. We are a lean organization with a massive impact across our 10-county region because of our dedicated membership.

We also extend a sincere thank you to the many nonprofit organizations who joined us this year in submitting creative applications for funds to invest in the community. Nonprofits do the hard work of making a difference and we are grateful for all that they do to improve lives on behalf of our community that make a HUGE IMPACT.

City Gospel	Having the Courage to Change Kitchen for New Building Purchase commercial kitchen equipment for the new kitchen that will be used to cook 150 hot meals each day for the women, and their children, who are in the residential treatment program
	Launch2Independence Program  Provide support to a program that connects young adults ages 18-25, who have been released from social service systems, with a community of care to help them navigate their transition to independent adulthood
Life Learning Center	Pillars Café Transformation  Upgrade the kitchen by purchasing commercial equipment & supplies to support clients with food insecurities to be better prepared to complete classwork, keep appointments and eventually earn long-term employment
Price Hill	Homesteading Program  Assist in the purchase and renovating of blighted properties while helping low to moderate income families that do not qualify for conventional financing become homeowners as well as supporting Price Hill as a desirable place to live





# \$6.4 Million
