



Impact 100 Cincinnati Grant Eligibility

Organizations that apply to Impact 100 must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Applicants must be registered as a 501(c)(3) or 509(a) public charity and with a letter from the IRS available as a .pdf **and be providing services aligned with an Impact 100 Focus Area (Culture; Education; Environment, Preservation, & Recreation; Family, Health & Wellness)**
- The proposed project must directly serve communities within at least one of the following counties: in Ohio—Hamilton, Clermont, Butler, Warren, Brown, or Adams; in Kentucky—Boone, Campbell, or Kenton; and in Indiana—Dearborn.
- Only new initiatives or significant expansions of existing programs are eligible. Proposals must demonstrate a clear community need, measurable outcomes, and sustainable impact. Projects must be able to utilize the full \$100,000 grant within a one- to three-year timeframe.
- Applicants must submit a detailed project budget, the most recent IRS Form 990 or audited financials, and documentation demonstrating the organization's fiscal health.
- Organizations that have received an Impact 100 grant within the past three years are not eligible to apply again during that period.
- Grant funds may not be used for endowments, existing operating expenses, partisan activities, completed projects, individual churches, indigent care subsidies, travel, loans, or for individuals.
- Collaborative projects are encouraged. In such cases, one organization must serve as the lead applicant and be responsible for submitting all required documentation. Re-grants to other nonprofit organizations are not permitted.
